MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF SEMPRA INFRASTRUCTURE FOR MEXICO AND CHIEF SUSTAINABILITY OFFICER

We are proud and delighted to share the results we achieved in 2024. This year was key to reaffirming our commitment through the lens of our 4Es: Education for the Future, Sustainable Electrification, Emergency Relief and Employee Engagement.

Thanks to this comprehensive approach, our work has generated a more significant, lasting and sustainable impact in the communities to which we belong, promoting prosperity and well-being for more people. As a result, in 2024, we granted a total of \$48.3 million pesos in donations to execute 84 projects across 16 states in Mexico.

Of our total grant contributions in 2024, \$33.8 million pesos were allocated to our Sustainable Electrification foundation priority. These resources supported the installation of clean energy solutions in facilities serving vulnerable groups, contributing to energy equity in Mexico. In doing so, we expanded access to renewable energy, helped reduce

these organizations' environmental footprint and enabled them to achieve energy cost savings—resources they can now direct toward supporting more people.

For Education for the Future, we allocated \$6.7 million pesos to scholarships and training programs for talented youth, with a focus on energy and/or environmental conservation, helping them shape a better future.

Regarding Emergency Relief—our foundation priority supporting communities affected by natural disasters or crisis situations—we allocated \$1.5 million pesos to join the Mexican Red Cross' Winter Plan for the ninth consecutive year, delivering humanitarian aid to communities facing low temperatures during the winter.

When more people come together, the impact multiplies. That's why I want to highlight the results of the Employee Engagement foundation priority. More than 500 employees participated enthusiastically

participated by dedicating over 2,000 hours to volunteer activities. Their commitment to local organizations drives the growth of our initiatives, enabling us to broaden our reach and benefit more people.

Additionally, this year we took a key step to enhance how we track our work: we implemented the first phase of our new social impact measurement system. This tool will provide more accurate data on the footprint of our social investment over the medium term, allowing us to make better decisions and focus our efforts where they are most needed.

We will continue working to transform lives and build a more prosperous Mexico for all—guided by our steadfast commitment to contribute to the well-being of the communities to which we belong. Through teamwork, solidarity and long-term vision, we move forward toward a better world.

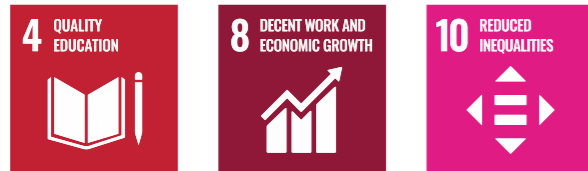

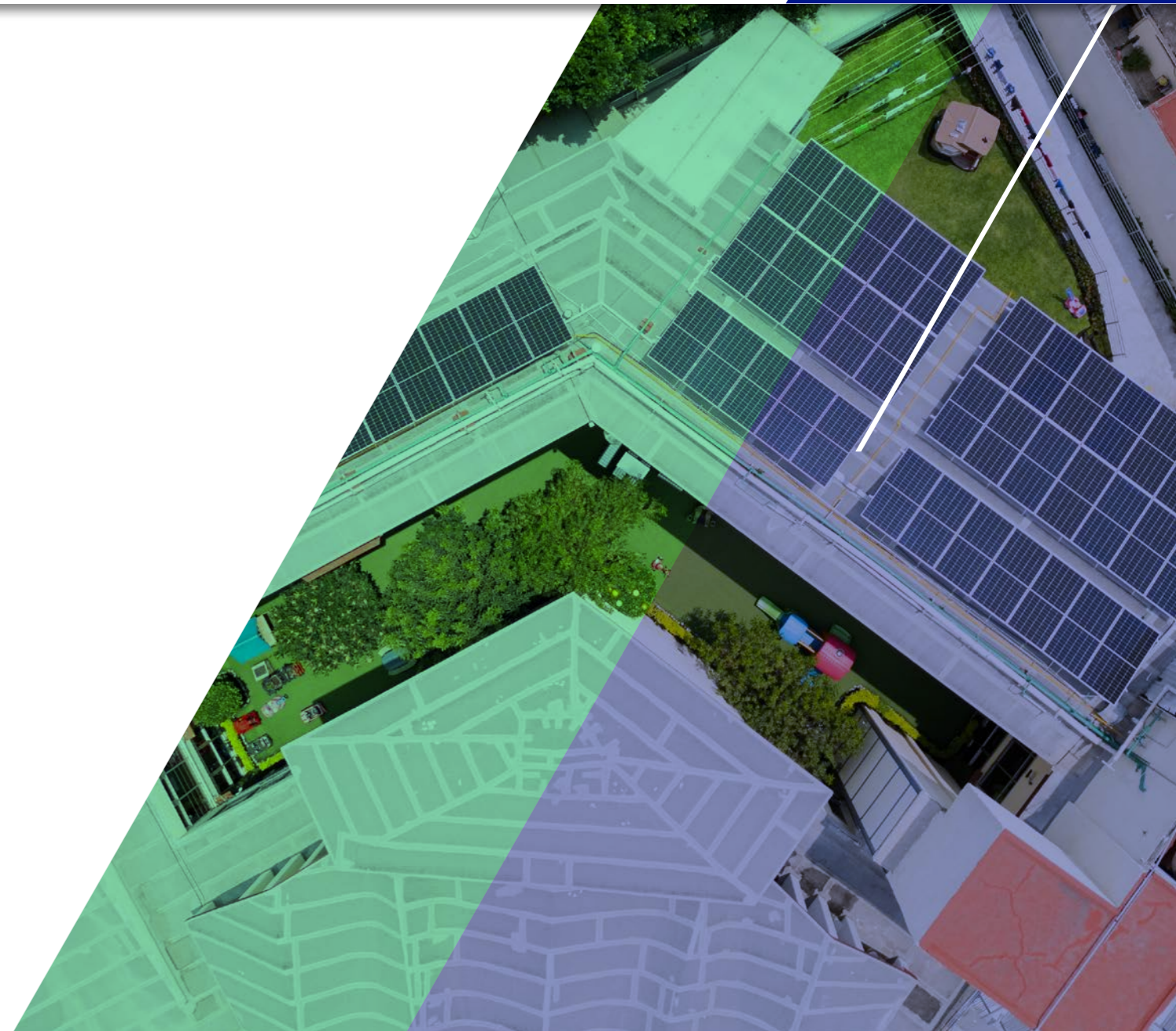

02 Engagement Campaigns

We carried out three social impact campaigns in 2024 to encourage employees to voluntarily contribute resources for different causes.



Back to school campaign: This initiative involved donating to nine organizations from the Triennial Program for Foster Home Infrastructure Improvements to ensure children and youth had the necessary supplies for the school year.

Our employees contributed \$274,574 pesos, resulting in 341 school supply kits. Sempra Infrastructure Foundation donated 269 backpacks to benefit children from eight of these foster homes.

82 employees participated in distribution events at each foster home.

Kilotón: To continue the effort launched in 2023, we conducted a binational campaign in September to commemorate Hunger Action Month.

The campaign was implemented in Mexico by Sempra Infrastructure Foundation, inviting employees to donate kilograms of rice and beans for local food banks. A total of 3,291 kilograms of food were collected and matched by the Foundation, reaching a total of 6,582 kilograms donated.

Holiday giving campaign: This campaign consisted of donating clothing, footwear and toys to children and youth from nine organizations in the Triennial Program for Foster Home Infrastructure Improvements during the holiday season.

A total of 464 employees joined the campaign, benefiting 327 children and youth. Distribution events were held with the participation of 148 employees.

In November, we hosted a charity bazaar at our corporate offices in Mexico City, inviting eight organizations that raise funds by selling cause-related products.

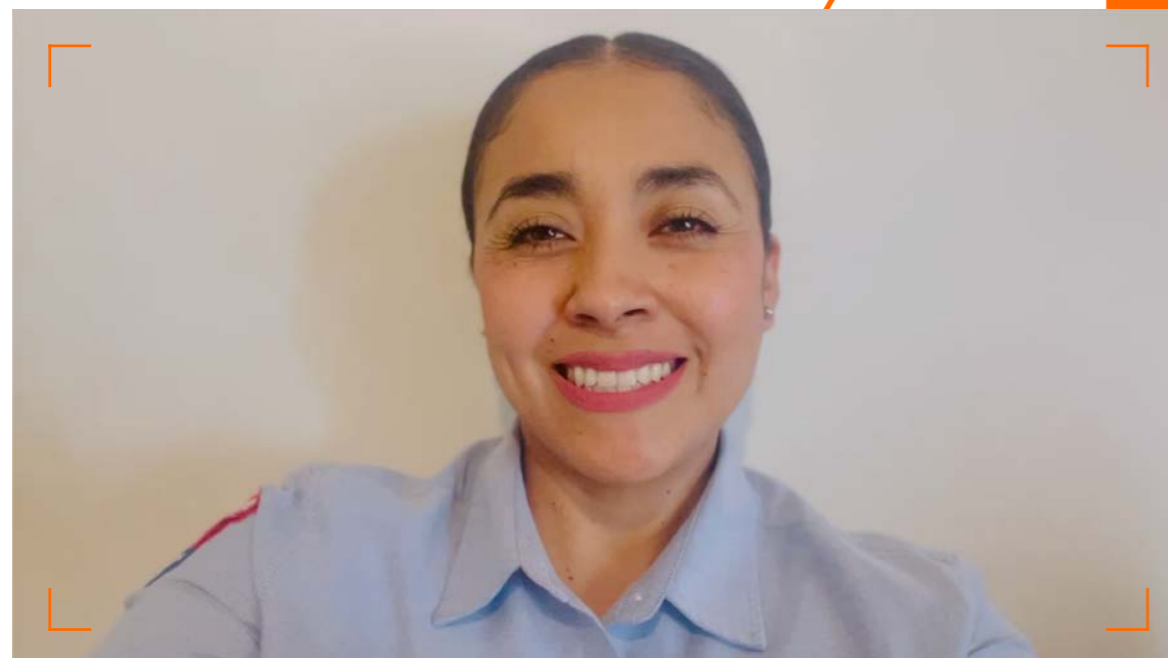

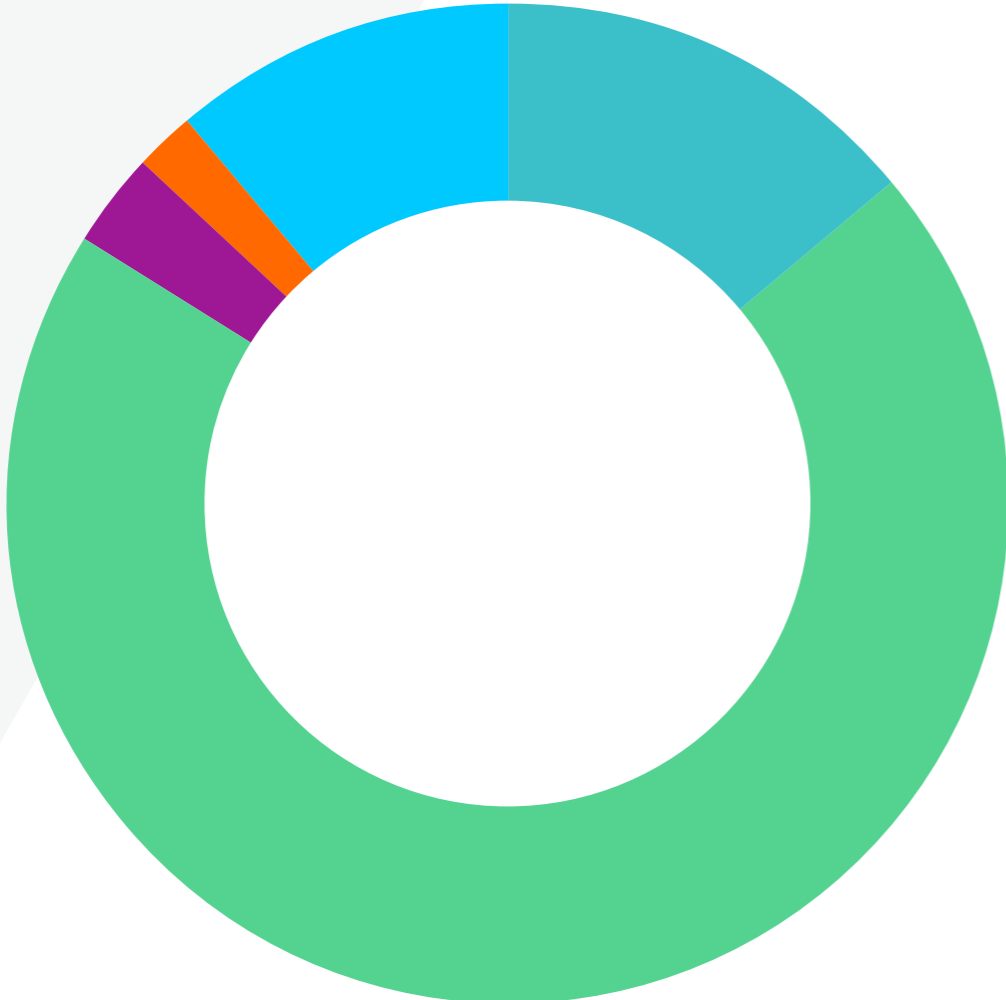
